## *When the Cupboard is Bare*

*For a friend of mine in his journey is come to me, and I have nothing to set before him? (Luke 11:6)*

How often it happens—there is a need, and we are empty. There is just no more that we can give out. We have reached the end of our resources. Our strength has collapsed in weakness and even our desire to do more is gone. Yet, even then, the needs do not miraculously vanish with our inability to meet them.

Jesus, in His foreknowledge, knew that in ministry there will always be more needs than can be met with our limited strength. He knew that our strength would fail, just at somebody's midnight hour. As His disciples today, we see that even Peter, James, John and the others struggled with the same problem. It is the Apostle Paul that teaches us that there is a way that His strength can be made perfect in our weakness.

The disciples have watched Jesus as he has given and given of Himself, meeting, a seemingly, unending procession of needy people. It appears that after witnessing this exhausting display of compassion climaxing in an extended time of fervent prayer, the disciples cry out, "Lord, teach us to pray..." Is there somewhere in their cry a call for understanding of how Jesus is able to continue to meet the needs of the hurting world, without totally collapsing?

Jesus' answer is simply this, when your cupboard is bare, turn to the one who has bread to spare. Even at midnight there is one who will meet your every need, if you have the will to persist and not give up. Jesus says the Fa-



ther will give a fresh infilling of the Holy Spirit to those who will ask, seek and knock at the door of the Father.

The Father's willingness to give the Holy Spirit is always there to those who recognize their need enough to seek His fullness. We must learn the difference between the need that must be met by our going the extra mile, and the need that can only be met by our getting away to a quiet place to rest in Him and be renewed by a fresh baptism of His blessed Spirit.

# Unfit for Doing Anything Good

The last part of Titus chapter 1 describes people who are “detestable, disobedient and unfit for doing anything good.” Yet, you and I know people who make no profession of faith in Christ, yet they do some good things. After much study, I have concluded that there is “good” and there is good.

Years ago, Jonathan Edwards wrote a book in which he says, “There is a concatenation of the graces of Christianity.” That’s a word we don’t use anymore. It means “go together” like links of a chain (only organically, not inanimate objects) or like the cohesion of water. We see this in the life of Christ Who is “full of grace and truth;” Who is “the Lion and the Lamb,” etc. What appears to us to be opposites come together in the Person of Christ. “Concatenation” also means “to be interdependent.” In order for something to be concatenated, there must be two or more things together in an interdependent relationship; again, like water. If you only have oxygen or hydrogen you don’t have water. But if two parts of hydrogen and one part of oxygen are “concatenated,” you have water. This is how Jonathan Edwards explained why Paul wrote “the fruit of the Spirit is...” and not “the fruits of the Spirit are...” If some of the qualities listed in Galatians 5:22 are seen in a person’s life, it may be just the natural psychology or temperament of the person. When the fruit of the Spirit is seen in a life, there is a “concatenation” of all the graces of the Christ-life in us—

they all go together and are interdependent. In our own strength, we can do what seems good to our natural understanding but that “good” is counterfeit, artificial and only temporary when seen through the eyes of God.

There are two grievous errors related to “doing what is good.” One is: **We can be saved by “doing what is good.”** Paul clearly refuted that idea in Titus 3:4 when he wrote, “He saved us, not because of righteous things we had done.” Yet, how many people around us everyday still think they will make it to heaven because of the good things they have done? The other error is: **We can do what is good in our own strength.** This is serious! Good deeds done in our own strength could be the “wood, hay and stubble” that Paul writes about in I Corinthians 3:10-15. “The fire

will test the quality of each man’s work.” If our work is “wood, hay and stubble” we will suffer loss even though we will “be saved, but only as one escaping through the flames.”

Jesus made it clear; “Apart from me you can do nothing” (John 15:5). “No branch can bear fruit by itself” (John 15:4). Paul wrote, “I can do everything THROUGH HIM who gives me strength” (Philippians 4:13). “For it is God who works in you to will and to act according to His good purpose” (Philippians 2:13). We have the joy and privilege of participating in His work. We are involved. We have responsibility but we do not have the ability in our own strength to do what is good in God’s sight. We are to “offer the parts of our body to Him as instruments of righteousness” (Romans 6:13) and be filled with the Holy Spirit, Who supernaturally enables us to do what is good. There are people who are prompted and enabled by the Holy Spirit to do good deeds of kindness as pre-evangelism evangelism. However, over time, those same good deeds can become something that anybody can do in their own strength and never result in making a disciple. It is so easy to reduce Christian ministry to what people can do in the energy of the flesh. Conversion can become nothing more than a Muslim converting to Hinduism. Distinguishing the “good” from the good is so difficult because, from the outside, both can look the same.



So, how can we tell the difference? Here are a few questions that may help:

- ♦ Am I totally dependent upon God and doing what I do “by the strength which God supplies?”
- ♦ Are there several seemingly opposite characteristic (e.g. joy and self control; loving God and others, even enemies; grace and rebuke) that go together to

Dear Pastors & Church Leaders,

Recently, an Alliance Church sent out unapproved emails and or letters to solicit funds. This church and its leaders were contacted and informed about the proper procedure for gaining approval to solicit funds for sister churches. Below is the C&MA policy regarding solicitation of funds:

**Solicitation of Funds**

If a church wants to send a solicitation letter for funds to churches in other districts, they must first have permission from the DEXCOM of each district before sending that letter. A solicitation letter from a church was recently received by churches in various districts. Since these districts did not first give permission for a solicitation letter to be mailed, this action was not in accordance with constitutional regulations. The reference addressing this issue may be found in the *Manual of The Christian and Missionary Alliance*, Section E-9 General Regulations, VI. Solicitation of Funds. Please remind your churches of this regulation.

  - ◆ Who is getting the credit/glory? If I did it in my strength, then I should get the credit.
  - ◆ Do I sense that what is happening is flowing from God through me or am I forcing and manipulating things to make them happen?
  - ◆ Do I feel pressure to produce results (larger attendance, more activities, more "professions of faith," etc.) or do I really see this as God's work and not mine?
- Read Galatians 5:19-25 and find the solution!



## CHILEAN ALLIANCE PREPARES FOR LONG EARTHQUAKE RECOVERY



The 8.8 quake that shook most of Chile's population on February 27 is among the ten strongest ever recorded. GPS analysis confirms that the city of Concepción shifted ten feet to the west and NASA reports that the earth's axis moved three inches. However, it is the human impact which cannot be measured so easily.

The Alliance suffered no fatalities, but many lost all they had. Twelve churches were severely damaged and three or four will need rebuilding from the ground up. A national offering has brought in nearly \$40,000 dollars from our Chilean churches, a large sum, but not enough to rebuild all that was destroyed.

Please pray for the effected churches, that they may offer hope to those who are hurting. The cold winter rains are due to arrive soon and many will face discouragement.

Bob & Cheryl Fugate encourage you to send your gifts through the Christian and Missionary Alliance for the approved special fund, "*Chile Earthquake Church Reconstruction*." Chile is also seeking partner churches that will stand with a Chilean church throughout the recovery process, in prayer, in giving and in working side by side in reconstruction.
