See Your Good Deeds...Praise Your Father in Heaven

During the 9/11 remembrances this past month, we heard a lot of praise for the heroic bravery of the 9/11 first responders—and rightly so. But that is different than what Jesus said: “Let your good deeds shine out for all to see, so that everyone will praise your heavenly Father” (Matthew 5:16 NLT). It is one thing to do a good deed and get praised for it. It is another thing to do a good deed and God gets praised for it. What’s the difference? Bottom line - if I do something in my own strength, I should get the praise. If God does something through me, God should get the praise.

J. Hudson Taylor said, “Realize that the work of God does not mean so much man’s work for God, as God’s own work through man.” Jesus said; “I will build my church...” And, He also said; “Go...” However, Christ admonished the apostles not to undertake this mission until they were endued with power from on high (Acts 1:8). It is God working in us and through us “both to will and to do His pleasure.” “Not by (your) might not by (your) power, but by my Spirit, says the Lord Almighty” (Zachariah 4:6).



Another way of looking at this is to ask “What are you doing more than others?” (Matthew 5:47). This is not suggesting that if unbelievers do ten “deeds of kindness,” then we, as believers, should do twenty. It is not a matter of quantity, but of quality. Instead of “wood, hay and stubble,” it should be “gold, silver and precious stone.” We should be like Joseph who did what he did in such a way that even Potiphar “saw that the Lord was with him” (Genesis 39:3).

If this seems confusing, try explaining “I have been crucified with Christ and I no longer live, but Christ lives in me” (Galatians 2:20). I believe this verse and Matthew 5:16 are connected.

But, how can I know if what I do is glorifying God? Here are some answers:

1. Obviously, listen to what people are saying. Are they praising you or God? Are they talking more about what you did or what God did?
2. Continuously, consciously, sincerely deflect the glory of God—because you want whatever you do in word or deed to be to the praise of His glory.
3. Recognize everyday how utterly dependent we are upon God’s enabling for fruitful ministry that glorifies Him. (Christ said, “Without me you can do nothing.”) Otherwise, we will be like the Israelites whom God warned, “You may say to yourself, ‘My power and the strength of my hands have produced this wealth for me.’ But remember the Lord your God, for it is he who gives you the ability to produce wealth”

Do the Intensive Labor of Re-Digging the Wells of Our Fathers

And Isaac dug again the wells of water which they had dug in the days of Abraham his father, for the Philistines had stopped them up after the death of Abraham. He called them by the names which his father had called them. (Genesis 26:18 NKJV)

I remember years ago as a child walking up to the upper pasture on Grandpa’s farm and searching for the upper spring that used to flow near the big rock and the early-spring apple tree. I knew that it was there somewhere—but where? The cattle had trodden everything down until there was little sign that there had ever been a spring there at all.

As I searched, I was looking for signs of heavier grass growth and wet land. Sure enough, there it was—not a free-flowing stream of water, but an area of grass and mud. Looking closely, I found the source of the spring, and began

to dig out the mud and weeds until there was a trickle of water, and finally, a true spring, giving forth its life-giving flow.

Thinking today of that hidden spring, I wonder what other springs that Grandpa and his generation had dug and entrusted to those of us who followed them on this journey of life. Are there springs that have been polluted by the enemy and are now lost to this generation?

Well do I remember sitting and listening in awe, enraptured by their stories of encounters with God: stories of power-encounters with the Baptism of

the Holy Spirit, where the heavens opened and lives were forever changed; stories of healings that could not be denied. My own grandfather and my mother testified of miraculous healings.

Now I am the grandfather who must pass on the wells that they dug to the next generation. I must share the times of refreshing that changed peoples’ lives. Well do I remember the morning in my first church in Boonville, New York, where the Holy Spirit fell upon the congregation, and nearly three-quarters of the congregation were on their knees in repentance and revival before the

(Deuteronomy 8:17-18). What a freeing thing it is to rest in God’s power that flows through us as a “channel of blessing!”

4. Consider the will of God. We must be led by the Holy Spirit if we want what we do to glorify God. God does not give His power to us to do our own thing. As you “will one will with God,” He will “strengthen you with power through his Spirit in your inner being.” It flows from the heart of God, into our hearts and out into our ac-

tions which others see and glorify God.

5. Check the motives. From God’s perspective, why we do something is more important than what we do. Did I do that “good deed” to make a good impression? Did I do it hoping that others will do good back to me? OR, did I sense the prompting of the Holy Spirit and, in obedience, depend upon His enabling as I did that “good deed” with an undivided, singleness of purpose - God’s glory?

IN SUMMARY: “If anyone serves, he should do it with the strength God provides, so that in all things God may be praised through Jesus Christ. To him be the glory and the power for ever and ever. Amen” (I Peter 4:11). In this context, I understand responsibility to mean that my role is response and God gives the ability. “Praise God from Whom all blessings flow!”

Lord; and the revival meeting in Hecla Park, where an 83-year-old man arose and started walking to the altar to receive Christ as his Savior. The Holy Spirit came with such power that, suddenly, people were falling at the altar until it seemed that nearly everyone was meeting God in a rich power-encounter that would **reshape peoples’ lives for years to come.**

What wells do you need to re-dig for those who follow in your way that they may know that God is real and all-powerful? It is intensive work to dig again the wells that have been polluted by the enemy, but we can not fail this generation—or they will never know that under the surface of this age, there is still a river flowing that can bring deliverance and

victory to broken lives and wounded spirits.

Isaac not only re-dug the wells his father had dug, but he also called them by the same names, so that the message would be consistent from father to son, on and on through the ages. When I was a young man, having given my heart to the Lord, I became very hungry for the deeper life of Sanctification. I knew that there was a well waiting for me where I could be filled with the Holy Spirit and be empowered to live the Christ life. I searched for that well and drank deeply of the fullness of the Spirit, and my life was changed. When I was sick, I knew that there was a well of healing where I could go to drink of the Divine life of Christ and be healed.



We must continue to re-dig the wells and call them by their proper names so that each believer who follows in our footsteps may find all the fullness of Christ, until the trumpet sounds, and we drink of that eternal well that flows from the Throne of God Himself.
