His Indescribable Gift

Christmas and giving go together. God is the Giver of every good and perfect gift. Christmas is about God giving His “one and only Son.” We are to respond in kind—like the wise men did when they brought their gifts to the Christ Child. We learn that, “It is more blessed to give than to receive.”

Continuing to think about “His indescribable gift” brought me to Romans 5:12-6:23 where “gift” is found a number of times. “But the gift is not like the trespass” (5:12). “Again, the gift of God is not like the result of the one man’s sin” (5:16). “How much more will those who receive God’s abundant provision of grace and of the gift of righteousness reign in life through the one man, Jesus Christ” (5:17). The summary of this section is: “The wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord” (6:23). Christ’s coming to earth that first Christmas was all about our salvation. “For it is by grace you have been saved, through faith—and this not from yourselves, it is the gift of God—not by works, so that no one can boast” (Ephesians 2:8).

In order to understand the magnitude of this gift, we must begin with God who is absolute purity and holiness. Secondly, we must have an accurate picture of ourselves as



depraved, helpless sinners who cannot save ourselves. This is what theologians call “total depravity.” That does not mean that everyone is as sinful as they can be. There are lots of good people around but when it comes to being good enough to get into heaven, “there is none good, no not one.” In the heart of every person there is the seed for every conceivable sin. Just because you have not committed the worst of sins, does not mean that God can accept you into His heaven. James writes, “For whoever keeps the whole law and yet stumbles at just one point is guilty of breaking all of it” (James 2:10).

The human reasoning goes like this: human beings are basically good; God is good. Since people are like God, then God is like people. In the process, the difference between the

Creator and the created is blurred. As a result, people lose their sense of depravity and their dependence upon God for their salvation. However, when we see God as He is, we respond like Isaiah, “Woe is me” and like Paul, “In me, that is, in my flesh dwells no good thing.” When we meet a person who is beginning to understand this, we know that God is graciously working by His Holy Spirit.

So, how can a pure, holy, just, righteous God give the gift of salvation and still be God? The answer revolves around the death of Christ on the cross so that God can be “just and the justifier of them that believe.” Unless God provides salvation through the propitious death of His Son, we cannot be saved. That’s how dependent we are upon

And, [Jesus] being assembled together with them, commanded them that they should not depart from Jerusalem, but wait for the promise of the Father... But ye shall receive power, after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you: and ye shall be witness unto me both in Jerusalem, and in all Judea, and in Samaria, and unto the uttermost part of the earth (Acts 1:4a, 8; emphasis added).

He announced His coming with the force of a supersonic jet. He came with a mighty rushing wind, tongues of fire, and a message that all of those who were present could clearly understand in their own language. He was all the "Promise of the Father." The first days' harvest under

the power of the Holy Spirit was greater than all the disciples had seen in their three and a half years of ministry.

He transformed the disciples from timid followers of Christ to mighty Ambassadors of a New Kingdom. He changed them from self-seeking, grasping men, vying for importance, to disciples with true servants' hearts. He brought gifts to equip the Church to do great and mighty exploits and to convince a dying world that Jesus Christ had come to bring Life, and that more abundant. Peter, a not-



so-humble fisherman who had once denied that he even knew the Christ, instantly became an evangelist that would bring multitudes to conversions that would change the world in his lifetime.

He transformed Saul, the persecutor of Christ, into Paul, the greatest missionary the World has ever known, and

Him. A basic law of heaven is: "the soul that sins shall die." For God to remain just, He cannot simply forgive sins and let the sinner go unpunished. But, His love for sinners motivated Him to provide a Substitute that would satisfy His righteous demands and the believing sinner would not need to die for his own sins. But, this Substitute had to be a spotless, sinless Lamb and only one Person in the entire uni-

verse could meet that requirement. This idea of "substitutionary atonement" was instituted by God in the Old Testament. But the blood of animals could not take away the sins of people. Then, John the Baptist introduced Jesus as "The Lamb of God which takes away the sins of the world." His death on the cross satisfied the righteous demands of a holy God. So, now God can declare the believing

sinner to be righteous. That is the heart of the Gospel. That is the message we have, the joyous privilege of proclaiming this Advent Season.

Let's never lose the wonder of it all. "Thanks be to God for his indescribable gift!"

made of him a love-slave of Christ who would gladly lay down his life and surrender himself into the hands of death for Christ's sake.

The Holy Spirit was the one who would make Christ real for the generations to come and would empower them to build the Kingdom for over two thousand years. He was the one that the disciples were told to wait for before they were to carry out the Great Commission. Their commission was to go into all the world and preach the Gospel to every creature. But, they were commanded to tarry in Jerusalem until they were empowered from on high.

The promise is still available today. "...[H]ow much more

shall your heavenly Father give the Holy Spirit to them that ask him?" (Luke 11:13b). Will it make a real difference in your life if the Holy Spirit fills you as he did at Pentecost? *Howbeit when he, the Spirit of truth, is come, he will guide you into all truth: for he shall not speak of himself; but whatsoever he shall hear, that shall he speak: and he will show you things to come* (John 16:13). *But ye shall receive power, after that the Holy Ghost is come upon you: and ye shall be witnesses unto me both in Jerusalem, and in all Judea, and in Samaria, and unto the uttermost part of the earth"*(Acts 1:8).

He may or may not come with tongues of fire or a mighty rushing wind, but the crisis will nevertheless be just as dramatic. Christ will live in you, and you will receive power

to accomplish all that God is calling you to do. You will receive the gifts of the Spirit that are needed to do the will and work of God. Miracles will follow your ministry as you yield to the leadership of the Holy Spirit in your life.

The work of the ministry is just as dependent on the indwelling of the Holy Spirit today as it was for the New Testament Church. The command is still ringing in the ears of the true followers of Christ as it did for the early disciples of Christ: "Tarry until you be endued with power from on High." Wait for the "Promise of the Father," and then go in the power of the Spirit to do the work of the Kingdom.

RETIRED OFFICIAL WORKER LICENSES

Retired Official Worker Licenses will be issued only one time now unless there is a change of district. Next year, only newly retired workers during that year will receive a Retired Official Worker License.

“The Retired Official Worker License shall indicate only the date upon which retirement began and shall be considered valid on a continuing basis unless revoked by the district in consultation with the National Office or until the worker returns to active ministry, whether full-time or part-time, or is deceased. It is the responsibility of the retired worker to inform the respective district office of their cur-

rent place of residence. Official workers may not retire with a Provisional Official Worker License.”
