Intimate Moments

And ye shall seek me, and find me, when ye shall search for me with all your heart (Jeremiah 29:13).

Some where in the deepest recesses of our being is a longing to experience intimacy with our Lord. Beyond the need for healing, or supplying our needs is this hunger to know God on a deeper more personal level. The Apostle Paul states it this way, *“That I may know him, and the power of his resurrection, and the fellowship of his sufferings, being made conformable unto his death;”* (Philippians 3:10).

To know Him, not to know about Him, or to have a casual relationship with Him but to know Him in the heights and depths of His person. The Power of God in Action

*G*od, Who gives life to everything” (I Timothy 6:13) is the omnipotent God of the universe. He not only gives life but He is “sustaining all things by the word of his power” (Hebrews 1:3).

For, example, God created the sun and all plant life on planet earth. Then He created mankind who eats the fruit of the plants. Photosynthesis is the healthy process in green plants by which carbohydrates are synthesized from carbon dioxide and water using sunlight as an energy source. (Without solar energy from the sun, there would be no life on earth.) Our bodies get the energy they need from food through metabolism, the chemical reactions in the body’s cells that convert the fuel from food into the energy needed to do everything from moving to thinking to growing. This is a vital process. If metabolism stops, life stops.

This is a great illustration for what happens when God invades our lives by the Holy Spirit and transforms us by His power operating in us. The pivotal Beatitude in Matthew 5:6 teaches us the importance of hungering and thirsting for righteousness because this is how we have the energy/strength to live out the rest of the Beatitudes in our everyday life. Whether we think in terms of “Christ in you” or “by being filled with the Holy Spirit” or “the Word of Christ dwelling in you richly” or “God’s strength made perfect in our weakness” or “God’s love poured out into our hearts by the Holy Spirit” or “God’s grace operating in us” etc., we can see this same principle of “metabolism” operating in the realm of the Spirit.

“Photosynthesis” and “metabolism” are also great illustrations for how God works in His church. Jesus calls it “all by itself” (or automatism) in Mark 4:26-29 when He helps us understand what the Kingdom of God is like by using the parable of the growing seed. God is the One Who generates the growth by His own power. We as Christ-followers are to be like farmers. We are not to strive to bring about growth but to create an environment that maximizes the opportunities for God to generate growth.

Henry Blackaby reminded us in Experiencing God that God is working all around us and we are to join Him in what He is doing. The question is, “How can we release the potential that is in that little kernel of corn so it will have a bountiful harvest in the fall?” God has delegated to us the role of the farmer. That means we need to remove the things that hinder His dynamic growth process. We can also do things like watering and fertilizing that stimulate that growth. But, we never give life or make it grow.

So, how are you as pastor and elders learning to identify where God is at work in the church you serve? What are people really enthused about because of what God is doing in them? Where are the emerging leaders because God is calling and gifting them for ministry? When God is doing a new thing among the young people, for instance, how are you facilitating the spread of that revival to the rest of the congregation? Where is precious energy being wasted on needless conflict that damages the life of the church? Are there ministries that

could be more fruitful if people were ministering in the areas of their giftedness? Are there organizational structures that hinder the flow of God's working? How are you combining energies (synergy) through teamwork and seeing the benefits of working together in the spirit of unity? How often do you think about these kinds of things in your meetings?

Let me be specific. What are you doing to involve new Christians in evangelism (with a mature Christian along side of them at first.?) Making a "new creature" is a wonderful example of God's power at work. New Christians have a natural network of friends who are unsaved. A tell-tale sign of a genuine conversation is a burden for lost friends. How much better to encourage new Christians to share their new-found faith instead of waiting until they become long-term pew sitters and need their zeal for lost souls rekindled.

It is too easy to rather mechanically keep ourselves busy with "off-the-shelf" programs instead of living by these biblical and obvious life principles that get us in sync with how God works.

Help your adults discover: (1) Why the Holy Spirit is critical to enabling us to pass on our faith to the next generation, (2) What selfishness does to our families' view of Christianity, (3) How living in the power of the Holy Spirit transforms our families' view of God and His Word, and (4) How to lead our children and youth to a clear understanding of a spirit-empowered Christlike life.
3. *STEPPING UP, A Journey Through the Psalms of Ascent*, by Beth Moore - This series explores Psalms 120-134. Traveling pilgrims sang these psalms both on the way to the great festivals of the Jews and as key elements of the worship at those festivals. Students will interact with Beth Moore and the Scriptures in new ways. They will gain a new appreciation for the life of faith as a journey to greater fellowship with and worship of God.
